ELMWOOD SCHOOL Grant Funding 2018-19

Pupil Premium Grant (PPG)

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) is additional government funding given to schools in order to enhance the progress, attainment and wellbeing of disadvantaged pupils. It is currently given to pupils in receipt of free school meals, children looked after by the Local Authority and the children of service personnel.

The pupil premium is additional monies given to schools to support pupils who are considered disadvantaged. The chosen measure for this is the entitlement of Free School Meals within the past 6 years, service children and those who are in Care.

In 2018-19 Elmwood School was allocated £39,275. The following charts demonstrate what we anticipate the funding will be spent on and the impact it will have to disadvantaged children.

Elmwood school has 54% of pupils on roll eligible for Pupil Premium funding.

How the Governing Body holds school leaders to account for the spending of the Pupil Premium Grant.

The Executive Headteacher reports annually on how the Pupil Premium Grant has been spent in the previous year and the impact that it has had on pupil progress and well-being. It also reports on what it intends to spend the current year Pupil premium Grant on in order to enhance the progress and well-being in the next year.

Elmwood School Pupil Premium Provision 2018-19

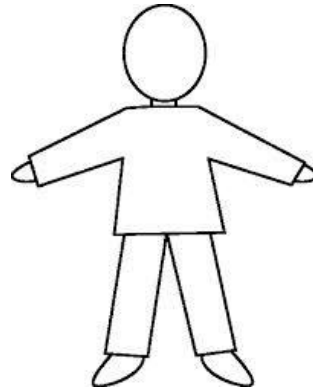
The current funding is approximately £39,275. Estimated costs have been allocated in the following way.

Interventions: Priority 1 – Quality Teaching for All

Overview: Pupils who are at risk of disengaging to access targeted support through outsourced provision.

Cost £ 11,610

Aim/outcomes: Improved engagement in learning linked with accredited outcomes. Increase in confidence and aspiration and access to further education following school. Maintained or increased attendance.



Supporting the whole child

Interventions: Priority 2 – Targeted Support

To provide Nurture Breakfast every day, to support uniform provision and specific resources to access learning, to support transport to and from school for identified individuals.

Cost £11,165

Aims/outcomes:

- Pupils will have a healthy breakfast at the start of the school day and a sense of belonging within their class and school community.
- Pupils will be ready to learn and have the most appropriate equipment and resources to support them
- Attendance will be maintained or increase.

Interventions: Priority 3 – Personal, Social, Emotional Development

Overview: To provide specialist Occupational Therapy to support identified pupils at risk of disengaging or at risk of exclusion due to incidents of complex and challenging behavior. To engage pupils in extra-curricular activities including after-school clubs and Holiday clubs to ensure they maintain friendship groups, continue to work and develop their social, emotional and personal skills in a variety of settings.

Cost: £16,500

Aim/Outcomes:

- Identified students will have Sensory programmes in place which support them to regulate throughout the day and have increased attention on learning.
- An increased number of pupils attending after school and holiday provision.
- Progress within Thrive data will show increase in confidence and self-esteem.
